

Guided Reading Syllabus

revised July 2007

We run a rolling three year programme which students may enter at any year. New students do a double introductory module covering hermeneutics, biblical theology, church history and pastoral studies which is individually tailored in the light of their experience and previous studies. They do this instead of the church history modules and one of the biblical 'in-depth' modules for that year. Students doing a second or third year do the church history module and the biblical 'in-depth' modules for that year. Each year there is an optional module which can be completed over the summer.
